Many places in the greater Plymouth area used to be farms. Is your home or a favorite spot located on one of them? How did the transformation happen? Using Plymouth as the focus, the [October 19th program of the Plymouth Historical Society](#) will explore the changes small northern New England farming towns faced in the 19th century as so many people moved west to new farms or south to the mills. Dr. Marcia Schmidt Brown will detail the impact of those changes on Plymouth and beyond.

Dr. Blaine is a professor Emerita of History at Plymouth State University. Since her retirement in 2021, she has served as a board member of New Hampshire Humanities and has been active in historical research and local service. She has frequently presented on historical topics for the NH Humanities To Go Program and elsewhere around New England and beyond.
