Plymouth Historical Society presents a program on Sergeant John Ordway, the local man who was third in command of the Lewis and Clark expedition. Historian Ronald W. Collins will trace Ordway's adventures from his boyhood in a part of Hebron that was once part of Plymouth to his mysterious death at the age of 42. Luckily, Ordway's detailed daily journals from the expedition survive.

Ronald W. Collins is a past president of the Hebron Historical Society and the author of *Sergeant John Ordway: A History with his Genealogy* and over thirteen other histories and genealogies.
